


After many months, the floodwaters finally receded and the ark came to rest upon dry ground.






The twelve followers were known as the disciples of Jesus.



#2 God wanted all followers to get baptized in water in the name of Jesus as their Savior, so that their wrongdoings would be washed away.


#3 The Holy Spirit was God's gift that He allowed Jesus to give to the people that obeyed Him.

Jesus' followers even discovered that the promise of the Holy Spirit was for everyone in the future who did the same thing as them.


